# Student Dress Code

The Department of Education requires all public schools to have a dress code and students are required to comply with the code unless they have been granted an exemption. Dress codes are tangible evidence of the standards expected of students and play an important role in promoting positive images Sunrise Primary School. A school's dress code supports all students to participate fully in school life. Dress codes can help create a sense of identity and a school culture in which every student experiences a sense of belonging.

The Sunrise Primary School Dress Code is for all students Kindergarten through to Year Six.

## Students may wear

- A school polo shirt
- Navy blue shorts/ skorts / tracksuits or leggings
- School dress
- School Jumper / Jacket with the school logo
- Enclosed shoes such as sneakers
- The school hat with logo. We will have a "No Hat No Play" policy in place. Students without a hat can play in the Undercover Area or Library.

## Further Agreements

The following are specifically restricted from school for various reasons, mostly due to safety and restrictions of movement:

- All denim (as per Department of Education Policy)
- Dangling earrings / or other jewellery that could get caught in learning or play
- Thongs/ heels/ slide on shoes
- Make up and nail polish (including artificial nails) are not to be worn whilst at school
- In the interests of hygiene, hair that is longer than shoulder length must be tied back



## Religious or Cultural Dress Requirements

At Sunrise Primary School we are very proud of our diverse and multicultural community. We take every opportunity to promote and support the diversity of our student population. We encourage our students who wear a hijab or turban as part of their religious or cultural practices to wear these in the colours of white, navy blue or light blue. We encourage students to proudly wear body adornments as appropriate to their religious or cultural beliefs however this is on a case-to-case situation, mainly regarding extensive jewellery or the carrying of a kirpan.

## Non-compliance with the Dress Code

Procedures for non-compliance with the school dress code have been developed in consultation with the school community, including exemptions and sanctions.

- Students who do not comply with the school dress code will be given a verbal reminder by their classroom teacher and/or the school leadership team.
- Students who continue to wear items that do not comply with the school dress code will receive a letter from the Principal reminding their parents and/or carers of the school requirements.

## Exemptions

A parent may apply to have their child exempted from wearing the school uniform.

The basis for the exemption must be one of the following:

- The unavailability of a component of the dress code from the uniform supplier (this is automatic, no formal application is required);
- A matter relating to the student's health.
- A matter relating to the religious beliefs of the student or their family.
- A matter relating to the cultural background of the student or their family.
- Any other matter which, in the principal's opinion, is sufficient to exempt the student from complying with the requirement.

An exemption, when granted, may also include conditions stipulated by the Principal.



When the Principal makes an exemption, the details of it will be recorded in writing on the student file and in Compass. The record will show the particular parts of the dress code that the student is exempt from; the period for which the exemption is effective; the grounds on which the exemption was made; and any conditions that apply to the exemption. A copy of the record will be provided to the parent who made the application and the child teacher(s).
